Course Description

The sixth grade language arts curriculum focuses on learning experiences designed to help students become independent readers and writers. It also enables students to reach their individual potentials in speaking, writing, listening, reading, researching, and utilizing technology. Opportunities for creative and critical thinking are provided daily. Technology is infused into the language arts curriculum.

Student Expectations

Q&E (quality and effort) will be expected on all student work. This includes turning assignments in on time, writing complete and thoughtful answers with details to support thinking, and using best handwriting skills while incorporating correct punctuation, spelling, and grammar.

Instructional Goals

Over the course of the year, instruction will cover the South Carolina English/Language Arts Standards. This course is designed to incorporate the elements of literacy skills, writing, grammar, vocabulary, research, and student creativity. Writing assignments will range from in-class journals to formal essays. Grammar will be taught using Grammar Flip, Quill, and within the students' writing assignments. Vocabulary and spelling strategies are taught within shared texts and the Stems program, which teaches Greek and Latin word parts. Reading is taught through student-selected and whole class novels, selected plays, poems, fiction and non-fiction reading selections from *Collections*. Independent reading logs are assigned and graded weekly.

Assessments/Grading

Students will receive several types of weighted grades each quarter.

Major/Test Grades (40%)

Reading Logs (minimum of 180 minutes of in-class and at-home reading logged per week) Reading/Writing Classwork
